



ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF GROUNDS FOR THE REFUSAL OF SECURITY LICENCES

The *Security Industry Act 1997* (the Act) and the *Security Industry Regulation 2007* provide for offences and circumstances for which the Commissioner must or may refuse a licence.

These circumstances include convictions, or findings of guilt, for certain declared offences and considerations such as whether a person is a fit and proper person to hold a licence.

The Security Industry Registry's Fact Sheet 6 (*Grounds for Refusing or Revoking a Provisional, Class 1 or Class 2 Licence*) enables persons seeking to undertake security training, or apply for a security industry licence, to undertake a self-assessment against the licence application refusal criteria outlined in the security industry legislation.

The Security Industry Registry requires Registered Training Organisations to provide a copy of Fact Sheet 6 to all persons seeking to undertake security training to ensure that they are provided an opportunity to assess their eligibility to obtain a security licence prior to commencing training.

Please note that the Security Industry Registry is not authorised to release criminal record information. Criminal record related enquiries must be made through the relevant police jurisdiction.
